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What is Work Force Development?

Who is this program for?

This program assists individuals in searching and maintaining gainful and meaningful employment. Clients, 18 years and older, are required to be referred by an agency and diagnosed with a disability and/or have suffered from drug and alcohol addiction or been incarcerated. Self referrals can also be assisted once they have been qualified by our mental health clinician in order to receive assistance. There is no special training provided by Frontier Community Services, all required training will be provided on the job per the employer.
